It was a hot summer, even Padraig said "do we have to go to the beach again, it's too hot" - What's wrong with that boy.


But a beautiful fall. We had success in our garden with our carrots, tomatoes and a few pumpkins.







The grandbabies are all fine, Ricky turns four in March, Marco in July and Teddy turns two in May.


