





* This is the story of the most shocking event in Story Book Farm Review.

* Tim Bleek, a reporter for the St. Louis Post Dispatch died at the Suburban Hospital in Bethesda, Maryland on November 14, 1970.

Tim was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Bleck Sr., died of what was thought to be viral hepatitis. It was not. It was from a T.B. vaccination. Instead of getting a good vaccination, he got a drug which later proved fatal. It also took the life of another reporter in Washington, D.C.

Richard Dudman the chief Washington correspondent for the Post Dispatch, said "in Bleeks death is a loss to journalism."

Tim was the winner of the awards. Con Lee Kelliher award. He also won the Most Promising young reporter of the year award. But Tim was not just a great writer he was a great man as well.
